Announcing the 21st Century Skills Program (Feb. - March 2022)

The J-MCP (Japan-Multilateral COIL/VE Project) is not a conventional COIL (Collaborative Online International Learning) course, but an online program jointly implemented by multiple universities located in Japan and overseas.

This inaugural module, **21st Century Skills**, in addition to developing students' critical language skills, is designed to help them acquire the necessary knowledge and tools to succeed in the international workplace (critical thinking, digital literacy, intercultural collaboration and cross-cultural communication, presentation skill, etc.) through collaborative projects with their overseas peers.

1. Program Overview

In order to accommodate as many participants as possible in this program, students will be divided into two groups. The lecture dates and the eligible participants for each group are outlined below.

♦Eligibility

Undergraduate or graduate students listed below and are in good academic standing (recommended minimum overall GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale) are eligible to apply.

Group 1: Undergraduate or graduate students currently enrolled in Kansai University or <u>UMAP-affiliated institutions</u>.

Group 2: Undergraduate or graduate students currently enrolled in <u>Kansai</u> <u>University-affiliated institutions</u>, J-MCP-affiliated institutions (listed below), IIGE-affiliated institutions (listed below), <u>AURORA-affiliated institutions</u>, and Applied Global Studies (AGS)-affiliated institutions (listed below).

Program selection results will be sent directly to students' home institutions via email from ku-coil@ml.kandai.jp by **January 24, 2022 (JST)**.

Please note that students are not guaranteed a spot in this program, and selection criteria is at the discretion of Kansai University. All selections are final.

3. Program Fees

There are NO application fees or participation fees for this program.

4. Language Proficiency Requirements

The program will be conducted entirely in English. CEFR B2 Level (TOEFL iBT 72+, IELTS 5.5+, Cambridge Examination 160+) English proficiency is recommended for non-native speakers.

*Proof of language certification is NOT required.

5. Digital Certificates

Students who successfully complete the program (over 90% attendance and completion of all assignments) will be eligible for a certificate in digital format (with learning hours described*) to be issued by IIGE (Kansai University) directly to students' home institutions within 3 months of program completion. Participants may still be eligible with one excused absence, provided that they inform the lead instructor(s) accordingly in advance.** Students' host institutions may interpret the certificate to be creditable (65 hours).

IIGE/Kansai University **does NOT** issue transcripts (official or unofficial), letters of credit approval, nor any similar documentation for this program.

*Assessment: letter grade with pass/non-pass option **Please refer to the terms and conditions outlined in the Commitment Statement in item 7 for further details.

6. Program Participation Requirements

Access

This program will be conducted 100% online, which requires students to have:

- a stable internet connection able to handle video calls without interruption
- a quality microphone/headset
- a functioning camera-equipped PC

Lectures will be conducted LIVE in English via Zoom.

Students will be required to register an account with the <u>ImmerseU CMS</u> (Course Management System) through which various course activities etc. will be conducted. Further information will be provided to students upon enrollment.
