Visa application	Once a student is accepted by the host faculty, the Acceptance Letter and Visa support package will be sent to the coordinator via email and postal mail for the student's visa application. Exchange students/researchers are REQUIRED to obtain their Non-Immigrant (ED) visa from a Royal Thai Embassy or a Royal Thai Consulate-General before entering Thailand .

GPA requirements	 3.0 out of 4.0 or 2.3 out of 3.0 (for undergraduate level) 3.25 out of 4.0 (for graduate level) Remarks: The GPA criteria is flexible for the exchange student(s) depending on the Agreement or the consideration of the host faculty/program of the exchange student(s).
Language requirements	 TOEFL (paper based) 500 / (computer based)173 / (iBT) 61 IELTS 5 TOEIC 600 Remarks: The above mentioned minimum scores are flexible for the exchange student(s) (unless it is specially required in the Agreement). However, the students are still advised to provide any of the above mentioned English proficiency assessment reports or an equivalent internationally recognized English language test as a proof of their adequate English language skills to Chiang Mai University. IELTS One Skill Retake and TOEFL MyBestScore are not accepted.

Transportation	 Getting around Chiang Mai is easy and affordable, with several transport options available: Songthaews (Red Trucks): These are red, shared pickup trucks that are a common and economical way to travel within the city. Fares are typically 30-50 THB per person for a trip within the city. You can simply flag one down and tell the driver your destination. Tuk-Tuks: These iconic three-wheeled vehicles are a fun way to get around for short distances. It's recommended that you negotiate the fare with the driver before starting your journey. Ride-Hailing Apps: Services like Grab and Bolt are widely used and offer a convenient way to book a ride with a fixed price shown in the app. This is a good option for travelers who prefer not to negotiate fares. Public Buses: Chiang Mai has a public bus system (RTC City Bus) that is air-conditioned and covers several main routes, including to the airport and major shopping centers. The fare is typically a flat rate of 20-30 THB.
